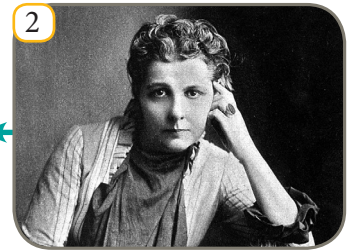

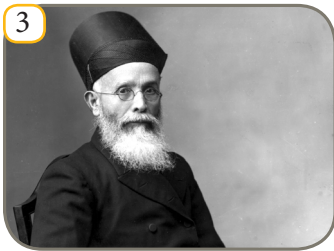
**B. Guess the pictures below of these freedom fighters and write down their names in the spaces provided.**



1 He was a Sikh boy, who was only 12 when he heard about the Jallianwala Bagh massacre and jumped into the fight for freedom.  
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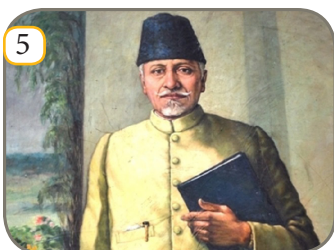
2 By birth, this lady was a part of the Indian Nationalist Movement. She founded the Theosophical Society of India. ....
