
C. Read the carefully and answer the following questions in this reference.

Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam: He was born on 15 October 1931 in Rameshwaram, Tamil-Nadu. He studied physics and aerospace engineering. He spent 40 years as a scientist and science administrator, mainly at DRDO (Defence Research and Development Organisation). He was also involved in India's space programme and 'missile development efforts. That's why he was also known as the 'Missile Man of India'. His dream was to become a fighter pilot, but he was ranked ninth. He designed a small helicopter for the Indian army and this was his career's start up. After that, he worked under the renowned scientist Vikram Sarabhai, the founder of ISRO. He became the project director of India's first satellite launch vehicle (SLV-III) in 1969. Dr. Kalam worked hard in developing the projects SLV-III and Polar SLV from 1970 to 1990. He served as the 11th President of India from 2002 to 2007, with the support of both Bhartiya Janta Party and Indian National Congress Party. During his lecture session at the Indian Institute of Management, Shilong, Kalam collapsed and died from a sudden cardiac arrest on 27th July 2015. India reacted to Kalam's death with an outpouring of grief. His last prayers and rituals were done at Rameshwaram. His death left a vacuum which can never be filled.

Title: Is a name for the story or work which is usually chosen by the author.

Front cover: Cover that contains the title, author and trade illustration of the book.

Spine: Is the narrow stiff part to which the pages and covers are attached to.

Gutter: The area where the inside margins of adjoining pages of a book meet.

Author: The writer of the book.

Colophon: An inscription placed at the end of a book with facts that relate to its production. These details might include the name of the printer and the date and place of printing.

Barcode: A code consisting of a group of printed and variously patterned bars and spaces and sometimes numerals that is designed to be scanned and read into computer memory and that contains information (such as identification) about the object it labels.

Back cover: Cover that often contains information like cost, bar code, author's bio or at times a short description of the story.

Illustration: The drawing for the title.
